
# Doing Words

The words that you have enacted are called doing words.

Words that tell us about the actions of people or animals are called doing words. They are also called action words.


Observe the following pictures.

Example:






When we talk of one boy playing, we say the boy plays.

When we talk about many boys playing, we say the boys play.



# Fun Time
