Adverb: An adverb modifies the meaning of an adjective, a verb or another adverb. For e.g.

- 1. She wept bitterly.
- 2. Aman meets him occasionally.

Types of Adverbs:

- **1.** Adverb of place: shows where an action is done. For e.g. The kids are playing inside.
- 2. Adverb of manner/quality: shows how an action is done. For e.g. She danced gracefully.
- **3. Adverb of frequency:** tells us how often an action takes place. For e.g. I **often** go to the park.
- **4. Adverb of degree:** tells about the degree or intensity of an action. For e.g. The team is **fully** prepared.
- **5. Adverb of time:** tells when something happens. For e.g. She will return **today.**
- **6. Adverb of reason:** Connects the conclusion with the argument made in the previous sentence. For e.g. I no longer have the support of the staff. I have **therefore** decided to resign.
- **7. Adverb of affirmation or negation:** used to confirm or negate an action. For e.g. I will **certainly** come to help you.

Interrogative Adverbs:

- Interrogative adverbs are question words like why, where, when and how.
- These words are linked to a verb, adjective or another verb.
- They usually ask questions about time, place, manner, frequency, reason and so on.
